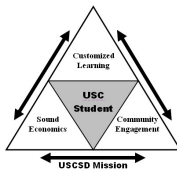
Isabel Tarcson, High School student, sang the Star Spangled Banner.

**DISCUSSION REGARDING SCHOOL DISTRICT PAYMENTS TO PSERS AND CHARTER SCHOOLS DUE TO STATE BUDGET**

MOTION: By Stern: I move that the Board authorize the Director of Business and Finance to withhold 100% of payments to PSERS related to the employer's obligations (but not the employees' withholdings) and withhold 100% of payments due to charter schools, commencing immediately and continuing until the PA budget impasse is resolved. Seconded by Kunselman.

There was full discussion regarding payments from the School District to PSERS and charter schools due to the state budget impasse. Ms. Cordisco forwarded a recent email that the School District received from the Pennsylvania Employees' Retirement System regarding remitting the employer share of contributions to PSERS during the budget impasse.

MOTION: By Oliverio: I move to table this item from discussion and vote.

MOTION FAILED BY NO SECOND.

MOTION: By Billerbeck: I move to amend the motion presented to read as follows: I move that the Board authorize the Director of Business and Finance to withhold 100% of payments to PSERS related to the employer's obligations (but not the employees' withholdings) and continue to make payments due to charter schools, commencing immediately and continuing until the PA budget impasse is resolved. Seconded by Mafrice.

I move that the Board authorize the Director of Business and Finance to withhold 100% of payments to PSERS related to the employer’s obligations (but not the employees’ withholdings) and withhold 24.1%, representing the portion of the 2015-16 budgeted revenues from state and federal sources, of payments due to charter schools commencing immediately and continuing until a 2015-16 state budget is adopted into law. Seconded by Stern, and carried on a majority roll call vote of 7-1. (Mr. Oliverio voted nay.)
